Color Palette




Original Home Page Image Before Edits






I took the sketches and put them into Adobe XD. I tested the wireframes with different photos that I would be using.

Photo Styling Test:




I brought the image into Photoshop trying to find the right balance. Using the transparent gradient and mask, I was able to hide a lot of the distractions. For example, in the curbing behind my shoulder I was able to keep enough texture to have a seamless transition into the photo.



High Fidelity


After getting my logo made, I collected all my past projects that I wanted to feature on my site. I made a portfolio images folder and organized them by project. I had a photo shoot that I had done recently and included those images in the file. I settled on an image that I imported into Photoshop and put a linear black to transparent gradient from left to right. Then, I used a mask over the gradient to bring out the part of the image I wanted to show. I tried having it completely black but, I felt a little bit textured leaves showing through added a nice dimension to the background image that would show on the home page.



Digital Mockup for Debbie Murdock Portfolio Website



I was able to get hosting through NameHero.com. It's been easy to use the cPanel. I set up FTP connections to transfer my pages as I coded them. As I designed, I kept the components of Bootstrap in mind to implement them into the design. I was able to incorporate the following components into the project from Bootstrap:

- Utilities
- Forms
- Layout

If there was specific styles that needed to be created, I would override the Bootstrap variables with custom CSS.



Conclusion

Objective

My objective was to create a clean portfolio website that would not distract from the project pieces but allow them to stand out. I kept the site to two contrasting colors with black and white used for the background and typography. For easy readability a sans serif was used for the body copy. I also wanted to have a fun creative element tied in and used a script font for titles.

I left plenty of white space for the eyes to move through the design on the screen. I used an appropriate line height to leave the body copy also legible and didn't have it span too far across the screen.

Challenges

The biggest challenge I faced was with getting familiar with Bootstrap. I was not used to putting so many <div>s in the HTML and would always be deficient caused the styling not to appear as I intended. After a while, it got easier to work with the containers, rows and columns. I made the layout come together a bit faster after I got the hang of it.

Another challenge was gathering all the images for the projects and optimizing them. Some of my project images were linked to InDesign programs so I would have to go into the original projects to get a new jpeg. Since my school work had been moved to another location, some of the links would be broken or fonts missing. As a result, I had to reconstruct some of my projects to be able to save the images.

For the last challenge, I chose to use the beta version 5.0. Some of the classes changed but sometimes the classes would not change the styles and I would find myself on the wrong documentation page.


Learning

I'm excited to have a good grasp on the grid system in Bootstrap. The ease of setting up the layout on different-sized screens to be responsive almost felt like I was cheating the system.

There were 3 installation options to choose. I opted to use the CDN link so Bootstrap wouldn't slow down my site. This consisted of putting the link in the <head> section.

I styled the cards using the border and shadow utility classes.

All these experiences helped me form a solid foundation of the framework Bootstrap 5.0.
